Kindergarten, elementary, junior high, high schools, universities, hospitals, administrative agencies	No indoor smoking on the premises (installation of outdoor smoking areas is acceptable)	No indoor smoking on the premises (kindergartens · nursery schools, elementary, junior high and high schools also are not allowed to have outdoor smoking areas)
Large scale eating and drinking establishments (such as chain store restaurants)	Eating and drinking establishments with capital > 50million yen, those with a seating area >100 m ² , and those that are newly opened have no smoking indoors (smoking rooms can be installed)	Eating and drinking establishments with employees must have no smoking indoors (smoking rooms can be installed)
Small scale eating and drinking establishments (such as individually operated stores)	Existing stores with capital ≤ 50 million yen and with seating area ≤ 100 m² can permit smoking if a sign showing the smoking area is posted (this is a transitional measure with an expiration date)	Only eating and drinking establishments that do not have (non-relative) employees (only stores that are operated by families who live together) can permit smoking if a sign is posted
The treatment of heated (not burned) tobacco inside of eating and drinking establishments	As a transitional measure “for the time being (for the indefinite future)”, heated (not burned) tobacco can also be used (in addition to burned tobacco) in a separate smoking room.	
Other facilities (such as offices, hotels, et cetera)	In general no smoking indoors (smoking rooms can be installed)	
Protective regulations for minors	Prohibitions to enter smoking areas	
Penalty (administrative punishment)	Managers: fines not exceeding 500,000 yen Smokers: fines not exceeding 300,000 yen	Managers: fines not exceeding 50,000 yen Smokers: fines not exceeding 30,000 yen (Penalties are not applied to heated tobacco)
